The Clive Room, Shrewsbury Museum, Shrewsbury, SY1 1LH

### Competition is open to:

Shropshire Students:

**Key Stage 3**, Year 7, 8 & 9 (combined) – **no theme**

**Key Stage 4**, Year 10 & 11 (combined) – **no theme**

**A-Level** Students in full time education – their entries will be submitted into the Student

Class (16-22 years old) **which has a theme**, this year being “**Beneath the Waves**”

- Maximum of 6 students from **KS3** and 6 students from **KS4**
- Maximum of 12 students per school from **KS3 & KS4**, one entry per student
- One entry per student from the **A-Level** students
- All entries must be submitted via the school & teacher.
- Direct individual entries will not be accepted.

### Teachers are responsible for:

- Registering students, returning registration forms **to Sally Perrin at [sperrin1954@gmail.com](mailto:sperrin1954@gmail.com)**  
**by Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2022**
- Selecting max 12 students from across the year groups excepting **A-Level** students
- Delivering & collecting exhibits to/from Shrewsbury Museum, Shrewsbury on allocated dates
- Attending Awards Reception evening with the students

### Competition Requirements:

Entrants for all year groups are to produce and submit a textile mixed media piece that should preferably use ‘**wool**’ somewhere in the design if possible.

**Key Stage 3** - Years 7, 8 & 9 combined - Max 6 students

Schools can decide the theme, with each entry accompanied by a written explanation of the key concepts, processes, skills, and links to the curriculum, preferably to include ‘**wool**’ somewhere but not essential.

**Key Stage 4** - Years 10 & 11 combined - Max 6 students

The focus/theme can be taken from any of the GCSE specifications [Art and D&T]. Schools can decide the theme,

accompanied by a written explanation of the key concepts, design processes, skills, and links to the curriculum for each entry, preferably to incorporate 'wool' somewhere but not essential.

**A-Level** Students – The theme is “**Beneath the Waves**” preferably to incorporate 'wool' somewhere but not essential.

The textile piece can be produced during lessons/coursework or students can produce a textile piece in their own time outside of the curriculum, but it would need to be submitted through the school. Each student can only submit a single piece whether it is from their coursework, or a piece created in their own time.

### **A Title and Brief Written Description:**

No more than 25 words should accompany each entry – no student names or school names to be shown on the front of an entry. Teachers will need to advise organizers to whom each piece of work belongs. Teachers to email copy of descriptions through to Sally Perrin – [sperrin1954@gmail.com](mailto:sperrin1954@gmail.com) a form will be supplied for you to fill in.

### **Criteria for Marking & Judging:**

Will be based on the overall standard of the work, design and quality of the techniques and processes linked to the age range and individual response and originality of the work.

Entries must be accessible for judging i.e., not in glass frames etc.

Mannequins/stands may be used for displaying an entry, \*please note you will need to supply these.

No larger than A3 if on Boards for display.

Exhibits should be ready for hanging or display with suitable hooks, wires, and specific mounting instructions if necessary.

### **Criteria for marking will include:**

- Quality of process and techniques
- Technical skills and standard of work (neatness – design originality, embroidered embellishments such as beading/appliqué etc).
- 2D or 3D
- Complexity and originality individual response

#### **KS3: Years 7 - 9      Aged 11 - 14**

#### **A-Level: Students Aged 16 - 22 in full-time education**

**\*NB** The judges may give more than 1 certificate for Highly Commended or Commended depending on the standard of the work.

**\*NB** All entries from students aged 16-22 will be considered for the **Jackie Ryan Award** which is a prize offering a two-week work placement to develop and design a woollen throw which is then woven and taken through into production as a finished product. The throw design is then offered to Tweedmill customers on an exclusive basis or may be included in the Tweedmill collection for purchase.

### **THE GRAPHIC TEXTILE AWARD** *open to all*

**The Prize:** £50 and the Winner's name will be added to the special trophy.

**Criteria:** The award will be presented to a **textile entry in the Textile Design Competition** who in the opinion of the Judges demonstrates an outstanding graphic textile design ability.



### **THE WOOLMEN COMPETITION** *open to all students aged 11 -16*

This award is to encourage the use of wool in a **separate** textile piece.

**Criteria:**

- Awarded for the most innovative use of the wool in a **separate** creation which is **not** included in the main Textile competition.
- The entry can be submitted either from course work or can be created independently but must be submitted through the school using the **Woolmen** registration form.
- There is a limit of one entry per student and 6 entries per Key Stage.

2<sup>nd</sup> Prize - £30 Gift Voucher

3<sup>rd</sup> Prize - £20 Gift Voucher

**Key Stage 4**

1<sup>st</sup> Prize - £50 Gift Voucher

2<sup>nd</sup> Prize - £30 Gift Voucher

3<sup>rd</sup> Prize - £20 Gift Voucher

**Judges:** Are selected from a pool of qualified external adjudicators, marking against agreed set of criteria.

**Public Exhibition of work:**

The students work will be exhibited at Shrewsbury Museum with Drapers Company members as stewards. The Exhibition is open to the public to view and students are encouraged to attend. A people's choice survey will run throughout the exhibition.
